FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY AND THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, PLEASE BE ADVISED:



THE COURSE, ITS STEPS AND SURFACES may be slippery when damp or wet. Golfers must wear appropriate footwear to meet the prevailing conditions. Wherever possible, keep to footpaths and steps. Take care when entering or leaving deep-sided bunkers and on steep banks.



LIGHTNING: In the event of an electrical storm, suspend play immediately and take appropriate action. A klaxon may be sounded as a warning.

Shelters around the course should not be used to shelter from electrical storms. Leave your clubs and take shelter, as low as possible, in a nearby bunker.



FOG: Do not commence or continue play in fog or poor visibility, i.e., when you cannot see the clear distance of your intended shot.

GREENS STAFF HAVE PRIORITY AT ALL TIMES

Players should always alert greens staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make a stroke that might endanger them and wait for staff to move out of range.



BUGGIES: To ensure the safety of all golf course users, buggy drivers are required to comply with the Club's Buggy Policy and follow designated buggy routes at all times. Take particular care on slopes and around ditches and deep-sided bunkers.

FIRST AID: Assistance is available in the clubhouse and pro shop.

PLAYERS ARE REMINDED OF THE NEED TO SHOUT "FORE" IF YOU CANNOT SEE THE FULL RANGE OF ANY WAYWARD SHOT.

- Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.
- Players should ensure that no one is standing close by or in a position to be hit by the club, ball or any stones, pebbles, twigs or the like when they make a stroke or a practice stroke.
- If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is a danger of hitting someone (including public roads or walkways adjacent to the club premises), they should immediately shout a warning. The traditional word of warning in such situations is "FORE". If hearing "FORE", crouch and cover your head.
- All golfers are required to exercise a reasonable degree of care on matters relating to Health & Safety in respect of other golfers and the general public.
- All golfers should be aware of the proximity of the roads adjacent to the course. Any balls hit over the boundary hedge of the course should be reported to the Club Office. Public footpaths run over the course. Members need to be vigilant and aware of the risk to public and golfers when playing either course.

You are advised to carry a mobile phone (switched off) to summon assistance in an emergency.
